FOOD FACTS:

Commonly called "bounce berries," ripe cranberries are firm and have air pockets inside, causing them to bounce. Farmers often use a bounce test to determine if their berries are ready for harvest.

Potatoes absorb and reflect radio wave signals the same way that humans do because of their water content and chemistry. So, in 2012 when Boeing needed to test their in-flight WiFi signal, scientists used 20,000 pounds of potatoes for their experiments. This project was aptly named SPUDS (Synthetic Personnel Using Dialectic Substitution).

When it comes to eating moldy cheese, it all depends on the type. Some cheeses, like Brie and Camembert, are actually made using types of mold and are perfectly safe to eat. However, soft cheeses like ricotta and cottage cheese should be discarded if found moldy. Hard and semi-soft cheeses, like cheddar and Parmesan, can be eaten after the moldy parts are cut off.

Unprocessed pistachios are dangerous. Under the right conditions, these oily, green seeds (commonly mistaken for nuts) can heat up enough to spontaneously combust. Because of this, there are strict shipping codes for pistachios.
